
Implementation Process Overview

PFE PRACTICE 5: PERSON AND FAMILY REPRESENTATIVES ON HOSPITAL COMMITTEE*



^{*} Representatives may also be referred to as Patient and Family Advisors (PFAs) or advisors.

The process of adding PFAs or advisors to an existing hospital committee, such as a patient safety or quality improvement (QI) committee, includes five steps:

1. Build a vision for the advisor role

- a. Determine the purpose and goals of adding PFAs to the committee: Why are they needed, how will they enhance the committee's work, and how will they contribute to QI efforts?
- b. Determine the role details and requirements: Length of appointment, qualifications, recruitment and selection process
- c. Produce a concise description of the PFA position(s).

2. Create buy-in among stakeholders

- a. Educate QI leaders and other hospital leaders on the vision and goals for including a PFA on the committee whose sole purpose is to provide the patient or family perspective
- b. Seek input and feedback from the QI committee chair, members, and other hospital leaders on the process and criteria for selection
- c. Identify and address critical concerns and hesitations
- d. Activate stakeholder support and commitment as needed to move forward

3. Recruit and select PFA(s)

- a. Distribute recruitment materials throughout the hospital and community
- b. Establish a process for collecting and following up on recommendations and referrals
- c. Ensure that the PFAs are representative of the communities served
- d. Select PFA(s)

4. Prepare PFA(s) and hospital staff to partner

- a. Onboard and orient new PFA(s)
- b. Identify and resolve potential logistical barriers and challenges
- c. Prepare committee and hospital to work effectively with PFAs

5. Monitor, evaluate, and adjust as needed

- a. Create and implement feedback outlets for committee members
- b. Establish regular check-ins with PFA(s)
- c. Assess and communicate the impact of including the patient and family perspective on the committee
- d. Address challenges, barriers, and concerns as they emerge

Four Key Factors for Successful Inclusion of PFAs on Hospital Committees

- 1. The PFA is well-prepared to contribute to the discussion and understands the contribution they can provide.
- 2. The PFA is included and encouraged to contribute to committee discussions.
- 3. The PFA is made to feel welcome, respected, and appreciated by the chair and other committee members.
- 4. The PFA has an opportunity to receive coaching and give feedback about their role and experience.
